Hi Lynette

I do not believe we are planning to need to do any dewatering.

I would say we were proposing a 300' self-support tower and if foundation size is a concern we could explore using a 300' guyed tower. I know that would have us using some additional space for the guy lines, but the foundation sizes are much smaller and less intrusive.

So that being said the 300' self-support tower will require less tree clearing and space, but will have a larger foundation. There would be three piers approximately 6' in diameter and could go 25' deep or deeper.

A 300' guyed tower would require guy anchor easements extending out from the tower, more tree clearing, but the foundations and the guy anchor points and tower center are much smaller.

We could work with whichever option better suits you although we would prefer a guyed tower.

Apologies for not following up on this – I had asked our permitting Department but was awaiting further confirmation before responding and that never came. This is the initial response I received:

If the tower is placed on part of the property that is used for the WWTP sprayfield, or percolation pond site, then the permittee of the WWTP will have to determine if the tower will reduce the application area for the wastewater application site, and possibly submit a permit revision. If the tower is placed in wetlands, they may need to get an ERP, or 404 permit. If the tower construction will have footers placed below ground and dewatering is required to construct the footers, then they will need to submit a Notice of Intent application to dewater the site, if the dewatering discharge will be to a stormwater drainage system, or surface water body. Otherwise, Vo may have more information about towers being placed on WWTP property.

That was the last I heard of it from our permitting team. As long as the tower doesn't interfere with the operations of
